


Colour Your Own - Curlew

The Curlew is considered one of Ireland's most threatened bird species. It has a long curled beak for feeding on minibeasts, its feathers are mottled cream and brown to help it camouflage to hide from predators. It has long legs to help it wade in the wet boglands in the Summer and the coastal areas of Ireland in Winter.
