



Over 200 species of plant, bird and animal were recorded on Coad Bog



Expert Rory Hodd recorded a massive 69 species of moss and liverwort on Coad bog



Frogs were recorded on Coad Bog in damp and wet areas



13 different habitats were found on the 10 acre site. These included wet bog, grassland, rocky outcrop, bog ditch and stream. The stream was the most diverse containing 22 different species



4m depth of peat was recorded in Coad Bog. The bog formed directly on Old Red Sandstone rocky soil



4000 year old pine stumps are present throughout the bog, black because of burning in the past



The students of Caherdaniel National school enjoyed an educational visit to Coad bog



304 working hours were contributed to the BioBlitz from 28 different volunteers



The pH on Coad Bog ranged from 5.1 in a bog pool to 6.8 in the stream
