Humble Bees

Return of the Curlew

Species Focus



The tadpole that hatches from frog spawn is the second stage in the frog life cycle and is completely aquatic. The length of this stage varies greatly from as little as two weeks to a year or more depending on water temperature and food available such as algae. They use gills to breathe underwater but develop lungs as they transition into froglets. Take part in IPCC's Hop To It Frog Survey and submit your sightings in our online survey at www.ipcc.ie.

Crafty Ideas - Make Your Own Beeswax Food Wrap



Beeswraps are a reusable alternative to wrapping food items with clingfilm or tinfoil. Simply wipe the beeswrap with cool water to clean. When the beeswrap is worn and no longer usable, you can cut it up into strips and place it into your compost bin. It is 100% biodegradable.

You will need (Makes 3 wraps)

- 100% cotton fabric measuring 36cm x 36cm
- Pure Beeswax (half bowl full/50g)
- Food grade coconut oil (1 tsp)
- Greaseproof Paper


What to do

1. Melt the beeswax and coconut oil in a bowl over a saucepan of boiling water.

Place the cotton fabric on a sheet of greaseproof paper.
 Paint the melted beeswax onto the square piece of fabric.
 Place a second piece of greaseproof paper on top of the painted fabric and iron on a medium heat.

5. While the wax is still warm, pull off the greaseproof paper and leave the beeswrap to dry.




