Energy improvement works commence at the Bog of Allen Nature Centre

Under the project management of KRA Renewables in early July the IPCC welcomed GoSolar and Dalmoy to the Bog of Allen Nature Centre to undertake energy improvement works. 2024 was the last year that peat was burned in power stations to generate electricity in Ireland. When peat is burned it produces more greenhouse gases when compared to other fossil fuels and the mining of peat has devastating impacts

on peatland habitat ecosystem services. Together we campaigned and called on the Government to end the burning of peat for electricity. As Ireland now works towards a net zero economy by 2050 on your behalf the IPCC want to lead by example through improving the energy efficiency of your peatland centre.



Your new blanket bog plant identification swatch

With funding support from the Peatlands and Natura Community Engagement Scheme 2025 the IPCC are working with Vitamin Creative Ltd. to design a new blanket bog plant identification swatch. Later this year copies of this new swatch will be distributed free to peatland community groups and educators working to share the value of and diversity of blanket bog habitat and plants throughout Ireland. Did you know that Ireland is home to



8% of the world's blanket bog habitat? This makes Ireland a significant location for this type of peatland habitat and it is important that Ireland ensures a representative sample is conserved for people to enjoy today and in the future.



Kildare County Council's community grant 2025



The IPCC acknowledge funding from and thank Kildare County Council for supporting volunteers at the Bog of Allen Nature Centre. Funding awarded has been allocated for a new pollinator planting bed, peat free wildlife gardening tools and identification swatches.









Peatland species monitoring on your national network of nature reserves

The IPCC's Conservation and Education Officer's, supported by volunteers, have been busy over the past few months undertaking the IPCC's annual peatland species monitoring programme. Your Hop To It Frog Survey 2025 is well under way with 171 records of the various stages of the common frog life-cycle received from twenty three counties around Ireland.

In April the IPCC's
Conservation and Education
Officer's started the annual
National Butterfly Monitoring
Scheme of the National
Biodiversity Data Centre.
Weekly monitoring walks have
taken place on your peatland
reserve, Lullymore West,
recording the diversity and

numbers of butterflies. To date eighteen of Ireland's thirty five butterfly species have been recorded in 2025. The IPCC also undertake a Bumblebee Monitoring Scheme on the reserve with six different species of bumblebee recorded to date.

On Lodge bog the IPCC completed the annual large heath butterfly habitat assesment and population count. Twenty six observations of the adult butterfly were recorded during nine site visits in June and July 2025.

Over the coming weeks the IPCC will be welcoming the conservation grazing donkeys to Lullymore West nature

reserve to help control grass growth and encourage the growth of devil's bit scabious, the food plant of the marsh fritillary butterfly. In autumn the annual marsh fritillary habitat assessment, larval nest count and scrub management will be some of the volunteering opportunities you can get involved with so make sure you are on IPCC's volunteer e-mail list, contact the IPCC on bogs@ipcc.ie to express your interest.

Dragonfly and damselfly surveys on Lodge bog and Girley bog



With support from Kildare
County Council through their
Heritage Grant Scheme 2025
and Meath County Council
through their Community
Biodiversity Action Plan Small
Grants Scheme 2025 the IPCC
are undertaking dragonfly and
damselfly surveys on two of
your nature reserves Lodge
bog, Co. Kildare and Girley
bog, Co. Meath. According to
the National Biodiversity Data

Centre Ireland has fourteen resident dragonfly, 11 resident damselfly and five vagrant species (a vagrant species is one that is identified outside its typical geographic range). Due to their dependence on water to complete their life-cycle dragonflies and damselflies are found on wetlands nationwide with one, the black darter dragonfly, being a raised bog specialist.





Féile an Dúlra 2025 - events and new transport link to the Bog of Allen Nature Centre



Féile an Dúlra 2025 is underway. Together we have celebrated World Curlew Day, National Biodiversity Week and hosted a bat walk at the centre as part of this annual festival of nature.

Some upcoming dates for your diary include Sunday 27th July as the IPCC celebrate International Bog Day from 12noon to 4pm at the Bog of Allen Nature Centre (R51V293). Enjoy guided tours of the peatland exhibition and peat free wildlife gardens, a bog walk to Lodge bog and for younger visitors a fun pond dipping activity will be available.

For National Heritage Week the IPCC have organised a series of events including offering free admission to the Bog of Allen Nature Centre from Monday 18th-Friday 22nd August

from 10am-4pm. Other dates include:

- Monday 18th August 6.30pm Lodge bog walk and talk meet at the Bog of Allen Nature Centre
- Tuesday 19th August 11am Lullymore West butterfly walk and talk meet at the Bog of Allen Nature Centre.
